Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge receipt of your communication of the 16th March concerning the completion of the memorial form issued in respect of your son, the late Lieutenant C. L. Miller, 6th Field Artillery Brigade, and note that Mrs. C. L. Miller, the late Officer's widow, has now returned to England. In order to avoid undue delay it will be necessary to forward the form direct from this office and I should, therefore, be glad to learn of the present address of Mrs. Miller in order that I may communicate with her on the matter.

The responsibility for the erection of permanent headstones over the graves of the fallen lies with the Imperial War Graves Commission and it was first laid down as a guiding principle that uniformity of design would most fittingly serve to perpetuate the memory of those who paid the supreme sacrifice, irrespective of their rank or station.

This policy has received the unanimous support of the Governments concerned and is being strictly adhered to, in so far as the graves in France and Belgium are concerned. For this reason it will not be permissible to erect other than the official pattern of headstone over the grave of the late Lieutenant Miller.
