

Dear Sir,

Early in the year I had a letter from Major R.
~~Harrison~~ 54th late 2nd Battalion, in which he mentioned
that he had left a Terciel rifle at Coates Ltd
Ctys, with instructions that it was to be sent to
me if he became a casualty. On 5th Aug 1916 last,
I had a wire from Colonel Luscombe Victoria
Barracks, Sydney, informing him me that Major
~~Harrison~~ was officially reported missing between
19th & 20th July. As 3 months had passed and
no word had come through, I made enquiries at
Coates office here, and was told that in May, the
military authorities had taken over all war trophies
left in their charge for transmission to Australia,
and advised to write you for further information.
